Introduction

FANN-NUCA collaboration

FANN09 have invited Norwich University College of the Arts to collaborate in a project that links art, design, media and architecture through an investigation of the urban spaces around us.

In the past, the enforced marriage of art and architecture in the environment and the design of buildings and cities has sometimes resulted in pattern and shape making and arbitrarily placed art.

We are questioning whether there a methodology which could be applied to examine the fabric, process, response, nature and subjectivity of art, design, architecture and landscape architecture? How are routes, buildings and the spaces in between buildings integrated into what is described as the 'urban-

fabric' and can art, design and media be used to signify, elucidate the meaning of space.

Outline

For this project students will have the opportunity to work with designers, architects and landscape architects to consider the two main themes below in relation to a number of local sites:

- The interrogation of what makes a space, ways of mapping, marking and recording
- The process of introducing an intervention into the space, visual, physical, virtual, to describe in some way, the meaning of the space, how it resonates with the individual, others, the past, present, adjacent spaces and the city...

Working in groups of between 6 and 10 with art college tutors and members of the FANN team, the aim of the project is to produce a collective visual re-

sponse to the ideas generated through looking and recording the cultural life and urban fabric of the city, concluding in an exhibition in the former art school refectory.

The exhibition, open to the public, is open on the afternoon of Saturday November 28 from 2-5pm.

There will also be an opportunity to see the cloister behind St Andrew's hall, outside the gallery lit up with a unique led lighting display to explore the buildings enclosing features of Garth Cloister and spaces between. This begins with the exhibition and runs until 6.30pm.
